#### History of Dhamdhama Anchalik College

Dhamdhama Anchalik College, established in the year 1988 at the initiative of the enthusiastic people of the locality was a long cherished dream of the people of this remote area. Dhamdhama Anchalik College has successfully completed 25 years of its glorious existence and has been provincialised under Higher Education of Goverment of Assam from January, 2021. Since its inception, the institution is imparting Higher Education to the economically backward classes of this locality, especially belonging to SC and ST communities. The college has greatly contributed to the academic and cultural atmosphere of the locality by its consistent effort and performance. The untiring effort of the dedicated teachers and the Management has turned the College into a leading institution of Nalbari District.

#### Location:

The College is situated on the bank of rivulet Cheng, beside the weekly market of Dhamdhama. The rivulet, Cheng, a tributary of river Burhadia, has surrounded three quarters of the area of the college. The college is situated almost 13 kilometers away from the district head quarter of Nalbari District, hardly 200 meters away from Dhamdhama Bus Stand and easily approachable from all sides.

- 3. To encourage the students to participate in co-curricular activities and to expose their individual potentialities.
- 4. To impart higher education to the students of the greater Dhamdhama area through the modern method and skill of education.

#### Vision

The vision of Dhamdhama Anchalik College is to make all round development of the students through qualitativeeducation. The College is dominated by the rural environment of the area. So the College is to become one of Assam's leading Centre of Excellence imparting modernized skill based education of the highest standard.

#### Mission

The mission of Dhamdhama Anchalik College is to give higher education to the rural people. We are committed to creating an advance technology based and co-operative learning environment and good infrastructure.

#### Motto

#### **General Rules of Admission and Eligibility:**

Generally, no admissions are allowed after the expiry of 30 days from the opening of the college. Students are, therefore, required to be admitted at the earliest after the declaration of their respective examination results. The admission to the college course will be subject to the following:

- 1. Admissions must be taken in person, after submission of online application form in the prescribed admission portal & on the online payment of the fees.
- 2. All admissions will be provisional and subject to confirmation by the Principal and approval by the University.
- 3. The Departmental seats for Honours Course are available as per the Reservation Policy of Government of Assam. The availability of seats for Honours Course against each Departments are as follows-

- 4. At the time of admission, the following documents and certificates shall have to be produced:
  - (a) Original statement of marks with the certified copy of H.S.L.C. onwards.
  - (b) Passing certificate and its certified copy. Certificate indicating the date of birth such as school leaving certificate or H.S.L.C. Certificate.
  - (c) In case of a student migrating from another University or Board, an eligibility certificate from this University.

#### **Rules of College Discipline:**

Students admitted to Dhamdhama Anchalik College must abide by all rules and regulations as directed by the governing body and college authority.

Violation of rules, irregular attendance, showing disrespect to the teachers and staff members, adopting unfair means during examination etc., will be regarded as offence. Students irregular in attending classes will be regarded as non-collegiate or may be debarred from appearing in the examination.

- \* Every student of this college shall abide by the rules of college discipline. Every student seeking admission to this College shall be required to fill an application for admission personally in his/her own handwriting.
- \* A student also makes a declaration to the following effect. "I hereby submit to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Principal and the other officers and the authorities of the College, and shall observe abide by the rules made by the Vice-Chancellor of the affiliating university in that behalf, and also by the rules made by the Principal of the college."
- \* Student must observe complete silence in the college premises. They must not loiter in the garden, passage and corridors after the classes have begun. They must read quietly in the library and spend their spare time in such a way, as not to cause any interference with the work of others. Absolute silence must be observed in the library as well as in the class-rooms.
- \* The students should be punctual in attendance and must be in his/her seat at the commencement of lectures.
- \* No Society or association of the students will be formed without the previous written permission of the

Principal.

- \* All the departments of the college will work according to rules, made by the Principal in that behalf from time to time.
- \* Students must keep their terms strictly in accordance with the rules of the University authorities for grant of terms. Terms shall not be granted in case of students, who are defaulter in attendance, tutorials, test and fees etc.
- \* Every student of the college must have an Identity Card. He/She should always carry it with him/her in and out of the college and should produce it whenever called upon to do so by the relevant authorities. This card shall be produced at the time of examination by every candidate for the Examination.
- \* The students are bound by all the rules and regulations made by the college from time to time. Any matter not expressly provided for in these rules shall vest at the absolute discretion of the Principal who also reserves the right of modifying of these rules as and when felt necessary.
- \* To safeguard its ideals of character and personal behaviour the college reserves the right to expel any student at any time for any reason deemed sufficient by the Principal as misbehavior in the campus of the institute.

- \* The Principal reserves the right to remove from the rolls the name of any student for failure to pay the Institute dues in time.
- \* Students are required to read the notices put up on the notice boards of the college. The college shall not accept any responsibility for any loss/ damage incurred by a student owing to his/her failure to read the notice in time.
- \* Smoking, chewing pans-gutkha, drinking (alcohol) and use of 'Drugs' are strictly prohibited in the premises of the college.
- \* Anyone found indulging in ragging in any form within or outside the college shall be instantly expelled from the college.
- \* Students are required to show due regard for the rights and property of the Institute. Any students found guilty of tampering/damaging the property fixtures, equipment, books, and buildings, vehicles etc. of the college shall be punishable and might be liable for expulsion from the Institute.

#### **Examinations:**

Continuous assessment of the student is done by the department through regular tests, seminars, projects and assignments. The marks secured by the students in these assessments are taken into consideration at the time of sending up the students for the final examination. The Examination Committee's decision in this regard is final and binding. Job training, projects, study tours and field work are essential requirements of a number of degree programmes.

#### **Examination Rules:**

- 1. All students must appear in all the examinations conducted by the college during an academic year.
- 2. Any student who is unwell may be permitted to avail of the sick room facility during an examination.
- 3. The following examinations are conducted by the college during an academic year:

TDC Semester I, II, III, IV, V & VI	Sessional Examinations, as per GU guideline.

- 4. For the TDC course eligibility for appearing in the final Examinations will be decided on the basis of their regularity in the classes and performance in the tests conducted by the concerned department with percentage of attendance.
- 5. For all College examinations, pass marks, as laid down by Gauhati University will be taken as the standard. Relaxation, if any, will be decided by the examination Committee for the finalization of the result of the Test examination.

Regulation of TDC Semester System & With Choice Based Credit and Grading System:

- 1. A TDC shall be of six Semesters covering three Calendar year. The schedule will be start as per UGC Notification.
- 2. Students' performance should be monitored throughout the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students' performances in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following :

Internal Evaluation: 20% Marks External Evaluation: 80% Marks

- 3. Internal Evaluation should be based on one sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars and library work in each Semester.
- 4. External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end of the Semester.

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- 5. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and that in each practical paper is 40%
- 6. In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
- 7. A student who could not appear or failed in any Semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows.
  - (a) First Semester with the regular Third Semester examination.
  - (b) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester examination.
  - (c) Third Semester with the regular Fifth Semester examination.
  - (d) Fourth Semester with the regular Sixth Semester examination.
- 8. A student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers in the First, Second and Third Semester.
- 9. No "repeat" shall be allowed in the practical examination in any Semester.
- 10. A student must pass all his Semester examinations, including "repeat" within Six years from the date of admission to the First Semester course.
- 11. Since the Semester involves continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.

#### Grant of Terms:

Admission to each academic year is a fresh one. The question of grant of term will be decided on the basis of the following factors:

- \* Attendance in general classes
- \* Attendance in tutorial classes
- \* Performance at sessional examination/ workshop/ seminar/ project.
- \* Test examinations, and University Examinations.
- \* General conduct of the student in the class and outside the class.
- \* Full payment of all fees due.

#### Academic Session:

The academic session of the college usually begins in July.

#### **Medium of Instructions:**

The medium of instruction is Assamese and English in both pass courses and Major courses.

#### Hostel:

The College has one girls' hostel which is Dhamdhama Anchalik College Women Hostel funded by University Grants Commission.

It is situated around the college campus. Hostel seats are allotted at the time of admission. Hostels remain closed during summer and puja vacation. Conduct in the hostel is governed by the Dhamdhama Anchalik College hostel rules.

#### Rules and Regulations for hostel border:

- 1. A Student once admitted will have to pay seat rent for the entire session even if she leaves the hostel midway through the session.
- 2. Boarder can leave for home twice a month with prior consent of the parents/ guardian.
- 3. Ragging in all forms is strictly prohibited.
- 4. Students taking coaching classes must take the permission of the superintendent in writing.
- 5. No boarder should disturb the other during the study hours.
- 6. Attendance during collective prayer is mandatory.
- 7. Boarders are to maintain cleanliness in the hostel compound.
- 8. A boarder must pay at least 15 days mess dues even if she had absent in the concerned month.

- 9. Use of mobile phone:
  - Mobile phone use is allowed in the hostel with the following conditions:
  - (i) Mobile phones can be used for essential communications only.
  - (ii) Use of mobile phones during study hours is strictly prohibited.
  - (iii) The Hostel Warden can check and verify mobile phone when required.
  - (iv) If complaint is received regarding misuse of mobile phone, the warden is authorized to seize the device.
- 10. No student will be allowed to stay in local guardian's residence without prior permission of the parents/ legal guardian.
- 11. Visitors are allowed only on Sundays during either from 9 A.M. to 12 P.M. or from 2 P.M. to 4 P.M.

#### **Hospital Facility:**

Dhamdhama Anchalik College has hospital facility for all the students, particularly for those residing in hostel.

#### Identity Card:

A non-transferable Identity Card is issued to each student at the time of admission. The card containing relevantinformation of the holder, along with a recent passport-size photograph, is duly endorsed by the Principal. Identity Cards are issued annually. Old Identity Cards are to be surrendered at the end of each academic year for renewal. The Identity Card is to be brought to the college every day and is to be produced whenever asked for.

Moreover the Principal has the right to recover such payment in case the above mentioned conditions are later found to be false or unsatisfactory.

#### Canteen:

The College Canteen remains open from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. It is under supervision of Management Committee of the college.

#### Award:

Awards are conferred to the candidates who secure highest position in G.U. final Examination.

#### Extra-Curricular Activities:

The College considers the extension work as the third dimension of the Institution and takes it to be as important as the other two dimensions, the research and teaching functions from the point of view of social usefulness and accountability. #### Library:

#### **Home Reading Sections:**

Text books can be issued for home-reading to students (subject to the availability of books). A student is allowed to take one book at a time and keep it for a maximum period of one week. The Home Reading section of library is generally open from 10.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m.

#### **Department of Bodo:**

#### About:

Bodo (बड़ो) also called Boro (बर), is a Sino-Tibetan language, primarily spoken by the Boro people of North-east India, Nepal and Bengal; basically BTR region and some corners of different districts of Assam. It is the official language of the Bodoland autonomous region and a co-official language of the state of Assam in India. It is also a language one of listed in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India. Since 1975 the language had been written using the Devanagari script. It was formerly written using Latin and Bengali or Assamese scripts. Some scholars have suggested that the language has to use its own script known as Deodhai but presently it is completely destructed.

Bodo literature developed when the native speakers became conscious of the significance of their own culture. The religious and social reform movement led by Gurudev Kalicharan Brahma, in the first decade of the last century, created awareness among the people. The first Bodo magazine, Bibar, was published in 1920. Since that period, the Bodo literature has been developing thoroughly.

The Bodo department of Dhamdhama Anchalik College has been established to fulfill the demand of the students and the area itself, as a large number of students belong to Bodo Community. The department was established in the year 2004. The college received permission from G.U. for a general course in 2007. Since 2005 the department has been offering both major and general courses. Permission for both major and Elective Bodo was received in 2013. Since its inception, the department has been endeavoring to make the students fit in the wide spectrum of demands of the present time, providing knowledge regarding language, literature and culture. The department gains the place of pride as it has been producing first-class holders consistently. The department also produces a Wall Magazine "THUNLAI BIDAM" (Tissue of Literature) to vent the creative ability of the students. The college could be able to receive the Govt. Concurrence for Bodo (MIL) course in 2009.

## A Summary of the GU UG-CBCS†

2020

#### What is UG-CBCS?

The undergraduate degree (UG) programme in the **Choice Based Credit System** (CBCS) will have courses spread across six-semesters of any undergraduate degree course. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions – June to May). The duration of the **Odd** Semesters (First, Third, and Fifth) shall be **June - November**, and that of **Even** Semesters

(Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be December - May.

#### How does it work?

The courses in GU UG-CBCS are categorised primarily into three types of courses - Core, Elective, and Ability / Skill Enhancement courses. All the core and elective courses will comprise of six (6) credits and the skill courses are of four (4) credits.

#### **Core Course**

As the name suggests, a core course is a necessary course that a student MUST take in order to complete the degree. The number of core courses for Honours and Regular degrees are different.

#### **Elective Course**

An elective course is the one for which a student has some kind of freedom to choose from a pool of courses. There are two kinds of elective courses - Generic and Discipline Specific. The generic elective courses are those, which can be chosen by a student belonging to any stream, while the discipline specific elective courses are particular to only the discipline concerned. However, a student pursuing an honours degree course can choose a generic elective from any other discipline except from the honours course itself.

#### Ability / Skill Enhancement Course

An Ability or Skill Enhancement course is aimed at providing the student with skill and ability. These courses have four (4) credits each in contrast to the core or elective courses. The ability enhancement courses MUST be opted by a student and the student can choose papers from a pool of skill enhancement courses.

#### **Dissertation / Project**

A student can opt (subject to conditions) a dissertation or a project work in lieu of a 6-credit discipline specific elective course in the sixth semester.

#### The Notion of Credit

A student needs to earn a required number of **credits** in order to successfully complete a degree. The credit is closely related to the number of stipulated classes a student has to complete. The following table indicates the number of credit a student can earn for each type of indicated classes. Page !1 of !7
